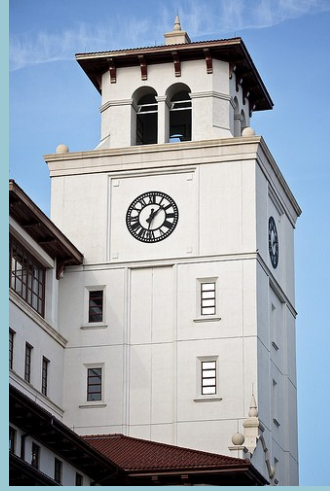

He currently serves as the Executive Director of the Educational Opportunity Fund Program and Academic Development at Montclair State University. His previous roles include serving as the Director of Student Activities, Director of Leadership Education, and Director of the Center for Academic Advising, First Year Experience and Testing. His research focuses on the academic and social integration of first-generation college students and he has conducted motivational and empowerment seminars across the country. He teaches his doctorate from Seton Hall University, has published two books, teaches college courses in transformative leadership and hip-hop culture, and has performed his poetry at venues nationwide. His most recent play “Til Death Do Us Part?” premiered Off-Broadway in NYC August 2010 and will run again this summer in NYC. The Wordstravel Library, named after his empowerment movement, is currently under construction for the Ghana Knowledge Tree Leadership Academy (Tema, Ghana).
